JUNE GENERAL MEETING

Our speaker is Fern Royce. In her words:

Sewing is part of my DNA. I was drawn to textiles from a very early age and learned to sew on a machine by age 10. I started quilting in 1995. I did not use patterns, but rather taught myself to "look" – find the block; figure out the construction.

My quilt inspirations come from a sense of curiosity and questioning: What if I did this? What if I added/subtracted that? Changed this? These explorations gave me a sense of independence and allowed me to find my own path.

My greatest joy as a teacher is sharing my love of liberated quilting and empowering other quilters to create their own work and trust their instincts, dispensing encouragement and tips along the way as they develop and hone their quilting style.

OPEN SEW

Due to Trinity's summer schedule, there will be an open sew on June 4 and another on August 27. We'll return to the regular second Tuesday schedule in September. See you there.

WORKSHOPS

There will be no workshops in June, July, or August. The next workshop will be Saturday, September 18. Terry Hodges will present Beginning and Advanced Paper Piecing. Registration for the Advanced class will close in July, registration for the Beginning class will close in August.

QUILT BLOCK CHALLENGE - February 14, 2019 - July 11, 2019

The theme is Music. Music arouses emotions, images, and memories in all of us. What does music mean to you? Do you have a favorite style, artist, instrument or lyric?

Please follow the simple rules below:

- The block must include your interpretation of the music theme by using your own fabric.
- You may use a pattern or create your own design.
- You may sew, appliqué, embellish, print, paint, etc.
- The block size must be: No smaller than 12" x 12", No larger than 18" x 18"
- Your project must be completed with quilting and binding.
- Completed blocks are due at the July 11th meeting.
