UFO CHALLENGE 2026 – STARTED IN FEBRUARY & REVEAL IS IN NOVEMBER

The UFO (UnFinished Objects) contest 2026 began in February and it's not too late to join! So get your UFOs moving toward the finish line!

Entry fee is \$5.00 per person, regardless of the number of UFOs on your list. Value of the cash prizes will be determined by the number of entries. Cash prize will go to the person who completes the most UFOs. For every UFO you finish by the November meeting, you'll get a chance at a prize. No limit to your number of prize chances, but only one prize will be awarded per person. Also, you must show your completed object during the meeting.

What qualifies as a UFO? Any unfinished quilty object: quilts of all shapes and sizes, placemats, tote bags, applique pillow projects, etc. We're not super picky.

Entry forms are available at the guild meetings. Fill out the form and list the projects you are going to enter.

QUILTED ART EXHIBIT





March 14 -Stack the Scraps, Teacher Leslie Sorenson, class fee \$20.00

This is for the fearless quilter who does not have to have everything “matchy-matchy”. We will be working on a variety of leftover 2 ½” strips. We’ll bring our fabric strips in a bag and share them. To make things go faster, I am going to ask you to make 3 star blocks ahead of time (instructions included). If you can’t get them done, we will make them in class. These would make great donation quilts.



April 11 – Quilted Jacket Teacher: Diane Rodrigues, class fee \$20.00

Create a jacket using an old or new quilt. Make a one-of-a-kind jacket for yourself or a friend. A great way to recycle a work of art.

May – NO WORKSHOP (*Happy Mother’s Day*)



June 13 – Disappearing Pinwheel – Teacher: Jane Strem, class fee \$20.00

Make an adorable pinwheel quilt, from table runner size to king size, you decide. This quilt is layer cake friendly. With one layer cake, a 10” square of fabric and one 10” square of background fabric, you will get two blocks. An entire layer cake will give you an 80 block quilt. There will also be sashing and cornerstones in Jane’s finished quilt.



July 11 – Applique Three Ways: Teacher: Jennifer Serr, class fee \$20.00

We will explore techniques including fusible web method, interfacing method (for a clean finish) and needle turn. Each technique offers a different end finish. In this fun workshop students will learn 3 ways to applique using this cute tomato pincushion pattern.

Using a man's shirt (upcycled or new) as a foundation for our snazzy shirt. We will modify and embellish the shirt to create a "one of a kind" fashion statement. Incorporate fabrics that you love to blend or contrast with your shirt print. Multiple fabrics are encouraged. Warning: this can be addictive!



October 10 – Japanese Rice Bag – teacher Terry Hodges, class fee \$20.00

Create a modern take on the traditional pouch used in Japan to carry rice offerings to the temple. Use yours to carry small projects, your knitting, your English paper piecing, or whatever you want. This is a perfect project to use up those extra scraps. This makes a great gift!



November 14 – Portrait or Self-Portrait in Fabric: Freddy's Faces – teacher Pauline Marx, class fee \$20.00

We will craft expressive faces with fabric scraps and we will be working in the style of renowned quilter Freddy Moran, who passed away in 2024 at the age of 94. You will create a collage using fabric and a glue stick. Pieces can be quilted and bound later in any manner you choose.
